Individual Placement Description – Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham

Placement	Cardiac Surgery
The department	The Cardiac Surgery department at the QE is one of six Cardiopulmonary Transplant centres in the UK as well as the only centre that performs the full breadth of acquired conventional Cardiac Surgery. The post operative care of our patients is based on Critical Care area D and ward 727. Trainees will have the opportunity to gain experience in a wide variety of surgical and medical scenarios pre and post operatively. Our Foundation trainees will be supernumerary and have great flexibility in their working pattern and learning opportunities. There is a great deal of Cardiology issues that they will be exposed to and this rotation will be a great learning opportunity for them. For those who are surgically minded, there will be opportunities to attend theatre every week and even take part in parts of the procedures. The trainees will be expected to take morning hand over and complement our ANP and SHO team on the ward.
