Main duties of the placement	Seeing patients in daily surgery. Home visits (supervised/alone as appropriate) Following up investigations and actioning results Formal training opportunities • Weekly foundation Programme teaching • Departmental teaching • On the job teaching We are piloting a new type of GP placement called GP-CO. GP with Community Orientation works slightly differently to the traditional GP set up, whereby FY2s will spend more time outside of the four walls of the surgery, working with different healthcare teams in different environments within the local community/local area. GP-COs will usually have two FY2s (occasionally more) that will split their time between usual GP practice duties and being out in the community, learning through observation and other means. The requirements, working hours, supervision levels are all the same. Since much of your team will be spent at different community sites you may wish to consider if you have access to a vehicle that you can drive; however, if you do not, this by no means excludes you and there are ways around this
