<b>The department</b>	Genito-urinary Medicine
<b>The type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	Managing patients in outpatient clinics based in the largest integrated sexual health service in the UK, with excellent senior support on the shop floor. This post also involves general medicine on calls on AMU or ward cover.  4 days self-development time per rotation
<b>Where the placement is based</b>	Clinics at Umbrella Sexual Health Services with general medicine on calls based at Birmingham Heartlands Hospital
<b>Supervisor(s) for the placement</b>	To be decided upon commencement
<b>Main duties of the placement</b>	Seeing and managing patients presenting with sexual health related problems in an outpatient clinic setting with excellent good senior support. Involved in medical on-calls which includes clerking and managing patients on medical assessment unit or ward cover. (Either 2 weeks of Monday to Thursday, or 2 weeks of Friday to Sunday [if one was doing day shifts during weekends, one will resume normal ward/clinic duties on following Monday ] – variable hours during each shift, ranging from 10 hours to 12.5 hours).
