The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Majority of work involves routine ward jobs, writing discharge letters, prescribing medication, cannulating and bleeding patients and reviewing post operative patients. There is the opportunity to assist in theatre, primarily during Caesarean Sections as well as reviewing new and follow-up patients in antenatal clinic, Gynaecology outpatients. On call duties include reviewing new patients in Pregnancy assessment unit, A&E and Gynaecology emergency unit. Opportunity to present at departmental meeting and undertake a quality improvement project.</p> <p>Formal training opportunities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alternate week foundation programme teaching • Weekly CTG Meeting • Weekly Departmental teaching • Monthly Postgraduate Teaching Meeting • 4 days of self-development time per rotation
Where the placement is based	Birmingham Heartlands Hospital, Good Hope Hospital and Solihull Hospital as HGS (UHB) under one trust. Service realignment means Emergency Obstetrics and Gynaecology service is at both BHH and GHH, Elective Obstetrics is at BHH and Gynaecology is at GHH. There is combined SHO rota for BHH and GHH placement.

Main duties of the placement	Routine ward jobs (cannulating and bleeding patients, writing drug charts, signing TTOs). Reviewing patients in pregnancy emergency assessment unit. Assisting in theatres.
