<b>Placement</b>	FY2 Paediatric Gastroenterology
<b>The department</b>	Paediatric Gastroenterology Birmingham Children's Hospital
<b>The type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>Trainees will be working with the gastroenterology team in both outpatient and inpatient settings'.</p> <p>Trainee will have out of hours duties with the hospital at night team where will gain exposure to general paediatric problems.</p> <p>As part of the University Hospital Birmingham F2 rotations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Simulation training sessions</li> <li>• Weekly Grand Round</li> <li>• Opportunities to teach medical students</li> <li>• Excellent support structure for Foundation trainees</li> <li>• Career support</li> <li>• Half day alternate week FY2 teaching</li> <li>• Bi monthly junior doctor FY2 forums</li> <li>• 4 days of self development time per rotation</li> </ul>
<b>Where the placement is based</b>	Birmingham Children's Hospital  (part of University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust rotation)
<b>Supervisor(s) for the placement</b>	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.
<b>Main duties of the placement</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Under supervision help manage in-patients as well as out patients.</li> <li>• approx half of role involves ward based gastroenterology work</li> <li>• duties include attending handover, seeing new patients admitted during the day, requesting/chasing investigations and keeping list updated</li> <li>• opportunities to attend clinic/endoscopy and participate in audit activities</li> <li>• regular Tuesday afternoon teaching provided, with ad-hoc teaching available with the consultant on request</li> <li>• the other half of the role involves general paediatric evening, weekend and night on-calls - this involves seeing new patients in the emergency department/GP unit, with the occasional need to help on wards if busy</li> </ul>
<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	Ward rounds, out-patient clinics, taking telephone advice calls, administration and out of hours duties.
<b>Employer</b>	Birmingham Children's Hospital NHS Foundation Trust provides the widest

<b>information</b>	<p>range of children's health services for young patients from Birmingham the West Midlands and beyond, with over 257,000 patient visits every year.</p> <p>We are a nationally designated specialist centre for epilepsy surgery and a trauma centre for the West Midlands; a national liver and small bowel transplant centre; a centre of excellence for complex heart conditions, the treatment of burns, cancer and liver and kidney disease; and we have one of the largest Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services in the country with a dedicated Eating Disorder Unit and Acute Assessment Unit for regional referrals of children and young people with the most serious problems (Tier 4).</p>
