The department	Paediatric Neurology
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Diagnosis and management of common and complex neurological conditions presenting in children and young people. Opportunities to perform procedures such as venepuncture, lumbar punctures and skin biopsies. Trainee will also have out of hours duties with the hospital at night team where will gain exposure to general paediatric problems. Where the placement is based	Birmingham Children's Hospital (As part of University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust rotation)
Supervisor(s) for the placement	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.
Main duties of the placement	Under supervision help manage in-patients as well as out patients.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Ward rounds, out-patient clinics, taking telephone advice calls, administration and out of hours duties.
