The department	Paediatrics
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	 Assessment, diagnosis and management of common and complex conditions presenting in children and young people. Opportunities to perform procedures such as venepuncture, blood gas, and lumbar punctures, attend child protection strategy meetings, and be involved with complex discharge planning. Trainee will also have out of hours duties with the hospital at night team where will gain exposure to acute paediatric problems. Clinical Supervisor(s) for the placement	You will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can act as your clinical supervisor during the time you are on duty with them. You will be assigned a named Clinical Supervisor for each placement and a specific Educational Supervisor for the year
Main duties of the placement	Under supervision, help to manage in-patients.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Daily consultant-led ward rounds and subsequent inpatient review and management. Administration. Weekly clinical presentation meetings, weekly departmental teaching session, Xray meeting, hospital grand round, and other teaching. Out of hours duties.
