Individual Placement Description – Heartlands Hospital

Placement	FY2 Paediatrics
The department	Paediatric ENT Surgery
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Predominantly ward based work looking after elective and emergency ENT inpatients. This covers a range of conditions including neonates with airway problems, cochlear implantation, neck space infections, routine ENT surgery complications and major head and neck surgery.
	Whilst not first on for ENT emergency referrals, there are ample opportunities for learning alongside senior colleages. There are opportunities to be an active team member and regularly undertake histories, examinations, formulate management plans, initiate investigations, and undertake practical skills. In addition, trainees are welcome to attend ENT outpatient clinics and opertaing lists.
	On-call work is for the Surgical Hospital @ Night rota and so covers ENT, neurosurgery and paediatric surgery but is well supported by by senior medical collegues and the hospital Site Practitioners.

Main duties of the placement	Ensure hand over lists are regularly updated. Present on daily ward round ensuring notes are up to date and changes to management or need for investigations are implemented. Organising and chasing up investigation results. Assessing and initiating treatment for some ENT emergencies with senior support. Monitioring M&M and presenting at departmental meeting.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Daily ward round every morning. Ward based jobs are usually completed in the morning. Afternoons for seeing emergencies, attending outpatients and theatre. Attend departmental meetings every other month. Teaching usually Thursday mornings. On-call duties as per Surgical H@N rota. Opportunity to partake in quality improvement projects.
