The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	 UHB is a tertiary referral centre for Burns, Breast reconstruction, Skin oncology and Hand surgery. It is a Trauma centre dealing with both military and civilian trauma. There are major learning opportunities in the assessment and initial management of all acute patients, burns and trauma. You will have the opportunity to examine and counsel patients for elective surgery in the pre-assessment clinic. You will have ample opportunities to gain valuable theatre experience in the fields of Plastic & Reconstructive surgery, Burns and Hand surgery. These skills are transferable to any branch of surgery. Supervisor(s) for the placement	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.
Main duties of the placement	 You will undertake daily Ward rounds including ITU for burns and acutely ill patients. Involvement in post-op management of patients following major surgery such as breast reconstruction, skin cancer excision, neck/axilla/groin dissection as well as skin grafts and flaps. You will attend a variety of theatre sessions: emergency and elective; GA/LA Exposure to outpatient clinics and involvement in management of new and old patients. Pre-operative assessment clinics where you independently examine patients and counsel them for a variety of procedures. On-call duties include ward cover, accepting A&E and outside referrals, well supported by SPRs.
Typical working pattern in this placement	 You will be allocated to one of 4 Teams: Burns, Hands, Breast, Skin Oncology. A weekly timetable is published detailing your daily programme A normal working day will involve ward rounds followed by a clinical session
